Color Guide For Perfect Litter:

Most cats dislike change, and may "go" outside the box when faced with an abrupt litter change. Use these tips to gradually introduce Perfect Litter by paying attention to what cats like best; what smells like them (that means "safety!"), and familiarity of filler texture and box location.

- 1. Scoop your current litter thoroughly to remove waste. Then add a top dressing (1/4 inch) of Perfect Litter on top of the current litter in ONE of your litter boxes, so the cat's familiar scent and old litter texture remains.
- 2. Gradually add additional Perfect Litter to the box each time you scoop to keep the box fresh. By the end of a week, most of the filler should be Perfect Litter.
- 3. Until cats fully accept Perfect Litter, provide a second litter box filled with the previous filler to prevent litter box aversion in stubborn cats.
- 4. Once your cats love Perfect Litter as much as you do, pour enough Perfect Litter into each box so it's about 1-1/2" to 2" deep. We recommend the 1+1 rule: one box per cat, plus one, to help prevent cats guarding or arguing over the facilities.
- 5. At least once a month, dispose of old cat litter, thoroughly wash the litter boxes, let dry and refill with fresh Perfect Litter.

Perfect Litter can help indicate a possible sign that your cat has a Feline Lower Urinary Tract Disease (FLUTD) by turning different shades of pink after your cat urinates in the box/tray filled with Perfect Litter.

clumps turn dark pink to red	There is a chance your cat may have an infection or may have FLUTD. If color persists, or if there are any other indications or urinary tract problems* contact your veterinarian immediately.
clumps turn medium pink to dark pink	Observe your cat for two days consistently. If color persists or gets darker in color, contact your veterinarian immediately.
clumps are light to medium pink	Watch color of clumps to see if they get darker pink in color. If clumps get darker in color, follow instructions above.
clumps do not have any shade of pink	Your cat's urine pH level is not abnormally high, which is good. Continue to use Perfect Litter as directed while monitoring for

unusual litter box behavior.
