AAVet Therapeutics, LLC

Developing new technologies in cancer therapeutics for animals. The company is a spin-out of Medosome, Inc., a Sid Martin Biotechnology Institute resident client.

AlphaChem Innovations, Inc.

Developing two products: an insecticide that deals with varroa mites (mites that kill honeybees) and a disposable self-sterilizing pad for push type doors.

Amend Surgical, Inc.

Medical device company specializing in bone graft substitutes.

Assembly Biosciences, Inc.

Developing two products: one is a class of oral biologic therapeutics for leveraging the therapeutic potential of the gut microbiome, and the other is for treatment of the hepatitis B virus. The company was based in Indiana and California and is moving another division to the Sid Martin Biotechnology Institute in 2017.

BioRegency, Inc.

Developing two products: one is a therapy for sepsis and the other is to validate potential biomarkers for sepsis (diagnosis).
